Background

Students from metropolitan and country areas enrol full time in a comprehensive cricket program from Years 7-12. There are four Department of Education and WACA approved schools in the metropolitan area enrolling Year 7 cricketers next year.

Course Description

Lower School

At all schools the four hour per week course covers:

- Development of batting, bowling, fielding and mental skills
- History of cricket
- Fitness training
- Match strategies
- Training camps
- Umpiring
- Captaincy
- Scoring
- Modified games/indoor cricket
- Interschool matches
- Interstate and international tours

Upper School

All schools offer Upper School University and TAFE bound courses to meet student needs. This includes the Physical Education Studies Course of Study and Certificate III in Sport.

Parents and students will be notified whether or not they have been selected into the program shortly following the trial date.

- Cricket whites and cricket gear (bat, pads, gloves etc., that they would normally use – equipment will also be available for use from the WACA).
- Running shorts and towel for fitness testing.

Parents are welcome to stay at the ground throughout the afternoon. It is essential that you attend the closing session where aspects of student/parent commitment and requirements to be a part of the Cricket Course will be outlined.
