DEPARTMENT AND WACA ENDORSED SPECIALIST PROGRAM

The Specialist Cricket Program at Belridge Secondary College develops young cricketers and provides them with high level skill development, specialist coaching, mentoring and game play in a professional environment. The program is built on supporting students to maximise their potential as an individual and as a team member. Both boys and girls are encouraged to apply.

Our program is fully endorsed by the Department of Education and Western Australian Cricket Association (WACA). The WACA partnership provides us with access to specialist facilities, players, coaches and high level competitions. Our own staff are highly qualified professionals, who have extensive experience as coaches and players. Along with their Level 3 High Performance Cricket Australia Coaching accreditation, they bring a love of cricket and a commitment to excellence. The success of our program can be seen in the number of state and national representatives that have graduated from our program.

Entry into the program is highly competitive, attracting students from across the state. As such, the stringent selection process is in place and includes trial days and support from the prospective applicant's local cricket club. We welcome applications from male and female students.

Throughout our program we have the theme of Cricket, Community and Culture. International and interstate trips are a component of the program in the senior years and our students contribute to our local

community from Year 7. Cricket program students are provided with senior school pathways, including ATAR Physical Education studies and/or completion of nationally recognised certificate courses. Throughout the program there is a strong focus on skill and personal development with highlights including:

- High Performance Coaching Accreditation
- Umpiring accreditation
- Biomechanical analysis

STEM AND HUMANITIES

Fostering student's individual strengths is what we do well and, for those students who are gifted academically, our Academic Enrichment Program (AEP) supports them to flourish. The AEP motto is "providing opportunity, embracing curiosity" and this is exactly what students selected for the program are able to experience.

The AEP students are supported and challenged through high level problem solving and a curriculum suited and catered to their needs. As a distinct class they have access to teachers with specialist training in gifted students and who have a deep understanding of student learning styles. The AEP program has a focus on the skills and attributes of 21st Century learners, as well as important content knowledge. These skills including creative and critical thinking, entrepreneurship, innovation and communication.

Learning experiences in the AEP program extend well beyond the classroom walls and include:

- University immersion activities
- Guest speakers
- Industry partnerships and experiences
- Competitions across the learning areas
- Specialist tutoring
- Incursions, excursions and enrichment activities

A range of academic information and testing is used to determine student's suitability for the program. This includes student's capacity to learn and commitment to the program, in addition to course grades.

The program is overseen by a dedicated coordinator who is a successful classroom teacher and brings extensive experience in working with gifted students to the role. The coordinator works closely with families and students to ensure every opportunity for success is available, and clear and open communication exists between BSC and home.

Our approach to pastoral care sees a clear commitment to the well-being of our students and a focus on the whole child. A focus on the development of students social, emotional and physical attributes is the foundation needed for them to flourish and is the prerequisite for academic success. Each day the work that we do is driven by our school values of "Respect Yourself, Respect Others and Respect the Space".

The Belridge Student Services team is led by the Heads of Student Services (HOSS) and work with specialist staff. The team includes year coordinators, inclusive education specialists, nurses, psychologist and chaplain. The highly trained team are focused on whole school, cohort and individual student needs, as well as promoting whole school initiatives including Bullying No Way! NAIDOC Week, Harmony Day and Respectful Relationship programs.

We are focused on celebrating and acknowledging the great students we have and do this through our "Positive Incentives Program (PIP)" and Good

Standing policies. We recognise that, at times, all students may need additional support to be their best selves. Our partnerships with external agencies complement the work of the student services team and, when required our comprehensive case management approaches give every student the best chance of success and achievement.

The team have a number of key roles at the College and these include:

- Overseeing the management of student behaviour and engagement
- Monitoring the well-being of students
- Supporting students to develop effective conflict resolution skills and restorative justice processes
- Promote and support school wide action to support inclusivity and anti-bullying
- Support student and families to achieve regular (90%+) attendance
