Carry over cash was \$251,092.92 Income and Expenditure based on last year's amounts. Increased learning area budgets from 70 to 75% of collection rate. School Board noted the draft budget. Reserve Account – Building, Land & Improvement (BLI) – N1555 – Balance = \$450,000.00 As mentioned in the Principals report, with the Election Commitment these funds will be reallocated to other projects around the school that may not come under the BLI definition, if this is the case these funds will need to be moved to another Reserve account prior to expenditure. It is recommended that the School Board approve any such movements that are necessary for accounting purposes.
