What is the Legal Position?

The State Government through the Department of Education provides placement at educational facilities for all students who choose to attend public schools. The Department also pays for the wages of all teaching and allied professional staff, plus costs such as repairs, maintenance and utilities, and basic resources with funding dependant on various factors such as student numbers, socioeconomic factors of the area and student characteristics. At Belridge Secondary College, we enrich the educational experience with funds collected through the Voluntary Contributions and Charges. Funds collected from families are spent on a range of resources including more specialised resources and consumables aimed at providing educational experiences that prepare students for the world beyond school. Belridge Secondary College has directed our efforts towards keeping costs as low and as equitable as possible. The Belridge Secondary College School Finance Committee and School Board examined the contributions and charges and approved the amounts shown in accordance with the Education Act.

Where do Voluntary Contributions and Charges go?

Some examples include ingredients in Home Economics, transport, photocopy materials, external instructors, textbooks, consumable materials for Art, Woodwork, Science, Physical Education etc.

How much can be charged?

Voluntary Contributions in WA Public schools are set at a maximum of \$235 per student in Years 7 to 10 for a nominal curriculum. However, additional compulsory charges above that figure can be requested for consumables and additional resources. For Years 11 and 12 there are no maximum charges set by the State Government. Schools set their own charges for these years, and such charges are compulsory. Belridge Secondary College ensures that all compulsory charges are reviewed and justified each year.

Who should pay?

Given that all students benefit from the pool of collected charges, it is fair to expect that all parents should pay the balance of contributions and charges. Parents of students who choose the more expensive option subjects need to consider the costs during the subject selection process. All would agree that it is unfair for those parents who meet their financial commitments to be seen to subsidise the education of those students whose parents do not pay their contributions and charges. This College is committed to an even-handed and responsible approach, so all parents should make contributions towards their children's education. When our College and community work together, our young people are the ones who benefit.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS & CHARGES

Voluntary Contributions Years 7 - 10

The maximum voluntary contributions a school may request is fixed at \$235. This contribution is voluntary; however, it is expected that those who can afford to, will make payment of the contribution. The contribution collected from parents/guardians is used for providing materials, resources and services directly used or consumed by students, including cooking ingredients, art materials, timber, metals & consumable tools, sports equipment, Education Perfect, hire of textbooks or the provision of text material (either hardcopy or electronically).

Compulsory Charges Years 7 - 10

Extra cost optional courses (elective subjects) outside the basic curriculum program incur additional charges above the Voluntary Contribution of \$235. For example, Sports, Metalwork, Woodwork and Food attract compulsory charges for items such as consumable materials and venue hire. Charges relate to items that students consume over and above what is supplied by the Department of Education. **All compulsory charges are required to be paid by Thursday, 2 April 2026** (unless a payment plan has been arranged). Please refer to Subject Charges – Year 7, Subject Charges – Year 8, Subject Charges – Year 9 and Subject Charges – Year 10.

Approved Specialist Programs

Specialist Cricket and Specialist Fashion Design are offered as Approved Specialist Programs at Belridge Secondary College. These programs will incur additional charges above the Voluntary Contributions. **Specialist Program fees are required to be paid in full by Thursday, 2 April 2026** (unless a payment plan has been arranged).

School Based Programs

Belridge Secondary College offers a range of school based programs: Academic Enrichment Program (AEP), Elite Dance, Elite Music and Specialist Netball Program. These programs, excluding the AEP and Elite Dance, will incur additional charges above the Voluntary Contributions. **School Based Program fees are required to be paid in full by Thursday, 2 April 2026** (unless a payment plan has been arranged).

Upper School Years 11 and 12

Charges apply to all Year 11 and 12 courses and are **compulsory**. Please note that they are not extra cost optional components. There is no established maximum charge for Year 11 and 12 courses, however the College will endeavour to keep costs to a minimum and not exceed the actual cost of materials, services and facilities used by the student in that year.

The College is able to, and does, request a 100% confirmation fee in advance for high-cost subject charges prior to commencement of the course. **All course charges are required to be paid by Thursday, 2 April 2026** (unless a payment plan has been arranged). Students will be required to pay for the auspicing component of certificate courses if they withdraw from the course, as the College must pay the relevant RTO (Registered Training Organisation). Refer to Course Charges and Certificate Courses.

Extra Optional Cost Components

Extra cost options are specific activities, services or facilities that schools offer for students to use or take part in. Excursions and camps, College Yearbook, student planner and College social activities are examples. Students opt to take part in these activities or use the services or facilities. The charge associated with the provision of these activities, services or facilities covers the cost of providing the service or running the activity.

The participation of a student in an extra cost optional component is conditional on payment.

PAYMENT OF VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS AND CHARGES

Collecting Contributions & Charges

The College will actively pursue the collection of charges by the following:

- Statements and reminder notices will be sent to the parent/guardian.
- With continued non-payment, the parent/guardian will be contacted to establish a payment plan.
- The College will insist that students choose low-cost subjects when non-payment of charges appears to be ongoing.
- Sanctions on non-curricular activities may be imposed at the discretion of the Principal. This could include camps, school socials and sporting activities.
- Parents/guardians who refuse to communicate with the College and have made no effort to make a repayment arrangement may have their names referred to our debt-collecting agency.

Payment Options

We urge you to start making plans now so that you are in a position to pay your Voluntary Contributions and Charges prior to the end of Term One. However, we are aware that this can be a burden for some families and it is possible to negotiate a payment plan. SECONDARY ASSISTANCE SCHEME

Education Program Allowance and Clothing Allowance

The Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) is available to secondary students whose parent/guardian holds a Services Australia (Centrelink) Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card or Veterans' Affairs Pensioner (Blue) Concession Card. The scheme is available to students up to and including the year in which they turn 18.

Applications are made by the parent or guardian for students enrolled in Years 7 - 12. Application forms are to be completed and returned to the College as early as possible in Term 1 and close Thursday, 2 April 2026. The Secondary Assistance Scheme is comprised of:

- \$235 Education Program Allowance to be paid directly to the College
- \$115 Clothing Allowance paid directly to the parent/guardian or the College

The Education Program Allowance will be paid directly to the College and will be applied to compulsory Charges first, followed by Voluntary Contributions. Parents and guardians can choose to either have the Clothing Allowance paid to them or directly to the College. If paid to the College, the funds will be allocated to compulsory Charges first, followed by Voluntary Contributions and Voluntary Approved Requests.

Processing of Payments

The School Funding Directorate will endeavour to have all clothing payments made to parents/guardians by 31 May 2026.

Late Applications

Late applications will only be accepted in extenuating circumstances and must be accompanied with a written explanation.

Eligible Interstate or overseas students who are enrolled after first term may apply for the allowance. Date of enrolment must be noted on the application.

Applications close Thursday, 2 April 2026 (last day of Term 1).

We urge all parents and guardians who have eligible cards to complete the SAS application form. Not only can it assist in purchasing uniforms, but it will also assist the school in purchasing consumables and resources that students require.



VOLUNTARY APPROVED REQUESTS

Voluntary Approved Requests

Parents/guardians are encouraged to contribute to help meet the cost of other services offered to students. Voluntary funding requests include;

Student Services

The Student Services team provides a valuable service to the students and their families by encouraging, motivating and inspiring young people to be the best they can and help them through life issues.

Library

The Library is a valuable resource in assisting your child with their educational programs. Funding will be used to ensure library materials and resources are continually updated.

Building & Grounds Improvements

Funds will be utilised in upgrading and enhancing your child's learning environment.

Technology

This will assist with a wide range of infrastructure upgrade and resources and allow the College to keep up to date with an ever-changing industry.

The College will keep requests to a reasonable level and within expectation of the College community.

Payment of voluntary requests is greatly appreciated.

OTHER COSTS

Student Planner

Students in Years 7-9 at Belridge Secondary College are issued with a Student Planner at a cost of \$15, to assist them with their planning. Replacement Planners can be issued at a cost of \$15: payable at Administration.

SmartRider Cards

SmartRider cards are issued to all new students. The cost of the initial card is free. Photos of Year 7 students are taken in the first couple of weeks of Term 1 and these are printed on the cards. New students who have not had their photo taken should request to be photographed at Student Services. Replacement cards can be issued at a cost of \$5.00, payable at Administration.

Printer Credits

Students receive an annual credit of \$2.50 on their printing account. When/if the credit runs out, students need to recharge their printing account at Administration.

Personal Items List

Items may be purchased from Campion Education or parent/guardians have the option of shopping around. If you intend using Campion, please follow the instructions on the list. Please note that the College receives a commission for all orders placed online through Campion Education.

Uniform Shop

The wearing of school uniform is compulsory for all students. Uniforms are available from the Uniform Shop operated by Uniform Concepts at Shop 5, 7 Delage Street, JOONDALUP WA 6027. OTHER COSTS

Yearbook

All students will have the Yearbook charge allocated to their account. If you do not wish to receive a Yearbook, you can disregard the charge and it will be removed at the end of the year.

Graduation

All Year 12 students will have a Graduation charge allocated to their account.

A Compassionate View

The College is aware that the payment of College contributions and charges can be a burden for some families. We encourage you to contact the office on 08 9408 8000 if you are currently facing difficulties for any reason. Payment by instalments, deferred payments and credit card debits are all available to support parents experiencing difficulties. The College is also keen to assist parents in selecting options that they can afford, and we will always ensure that subject charges will be available to parents prior to the selection of subjects.

Payments for contributions and charges are due by the end of Term 1, unless an agreement is in place.

Refund of Contributions, Charges and Fees

Where a parent/guardian pays for particular materials or services (e.g. excursion/camp costs) and the funds are not used for the purpose for which they were collected, the funds must either be used for other purposes approved by the parent or refunded to the parent.

When a student enrols at another school after the commencement of the school year we will:

- · Refund the unused portion of contributions, charges, or fees received from the parent or
- Transfer the unused portion to the new school through specific arrangement with parents and the enrolling school

Refunds will be issued by direct deposit only.

Refunds for Secondary Assistance Scheme (SAS) cannot be refunded directly to the parent/guardian, however the College can transfer the unused portion to the enrolling public school.

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE POLICY

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Policy Years 7 – 12

Belridge Secondary College is committed to supporting our students to ensure they are best placed for future employment and success. With more than 50% of the future workforce requiring skills in technology such as Coding, Virtual Reality and the ability to configure and build digital systems, the way our students engage with technology will shape their education.

Access to a personal device at home and school is a key component to support future success. Belridge Secondary College will continue to roll out a BYOD program for all Year 7 students. Students will use their device across the curriculum areas to access a range of web-based activities along with utilising the Microsoft Office 365 suite (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, TEAMs, Forms).

CDM is the College's preferred supplier. Devices purchased through CDM provide a 3-year manufacturer's warranty, including battery and support from the CDM helpdesk. Should your CDM device encounter technical issues your affected device is collected from the College, repaired and returned back to the College for your child. It is **highly recommended** that you have in place **personal accident loss** for your device. **Accidental Damage Cover is included through your purchase with CDM.**

Requirements for BYOD

Important Note: Your child will get the most benefit out of a laptop device such as a Windows 11 Laptop or a MacBook. If this is not an option, try to avoid purchasing Chromebooks and old refurbished tablet devices as not all of these devices are able to connect to the College's Wi-Fi and recommended software such as the Microsoft Office suite are not always available to install for these devices.
