The Specialist Cricket Program at Belridge Secondary College develops young cricketers and provides them with high level skill development, specialist coaching, mentoring and game play in a professional environment. The program is built on supporting students to maximise their potential as an individual and as a team member. Both boys and girls are encouraged to apply.

Our program is fully endorsed by the Department of Education and the Western Australian Cricket Association (WACA). The WACA partnership provides us with access to specialist facilities, players, coaches and high level competitions. Our own staff are highly qualified professionals, who have extensive experience as coaches and players. Along with their Level 3 High Performance Cricket Australia Coaching accreditation, they bring a love of cricket and a commitment to excellence. The success of our program can be seen in the number of state and national representatives that have graduated from our program.

Entry into the program is highly competitive, attracting students from across the state. As such, a stringent selection process is in place and includes trial days and support from the prospective applicant's local cricket club. We welcome applications from male and female students.

STEM AND HUMANITIES FOR GIFTED & TALENTED

Fostering student's individual strengths is what we do well and, for those students who are gifted

academically, our Academic Enrichment Program (AEP) supports them to flourish. The AEP motto is "*providing opportunity, embracing curiosity*" and this is exactly what students selected for the program are able to experience.

The AEP students are supported and challenged through high level problem solving and a curriculum suited and catered to their needs. As a distinct class they have access to teachers with specialist training in gifted students and who have a deep understanding of student learning styles. The AEP program has a focus on the skills and attributes of 21st Century learners, as well as important content knowledge. These skills include creative and critical thinking, entrepreneurship, innovation and communication.

Learning experiences in the AEP Program extend well beyond the classroom walls and include:

- University immersion activities
- Guest speakers
- Industry partnerships and experiences
- Competitions across the learning areas
- Specialist tutoring
- Incursions, excursions and enrichment activities

- Study the language of music and use it to compose their own pieces.
- Actively listen to music in wide range of styles to understand how to craft your desired sound.
- Receive practice time to develop instrumental skills on guitar, keyboard or their own tuition instrument. Pursuing your own instrumental goals and experience authentic performance opportunities in solo and group contexts.
- Become a beginner instrumental student with free small group/individual instrumental tuition through IMSS (Year 7 only).
- Engage with a variety of I.T. tools. Compositional, mixing and arranging technologies are used in each field of study to enhance the experiences and outcomes.
- Develop vital life skills including creative thinking, collaboration, confidence, and diligence – all transferable to success across all curriculum pathways and life outside of school.

In partnership with Instrumental Music School Services (IMSS), students will have access to a range of specialist instrumental teachers/ensemble groups. Students also have opportunities to perform at events and concerts within the school and wider community.

ELITE DANCE

Belridge Secondary College is proud to offer dedicated dancers an elite level of training within the public education system. The Elite Dance Program creates an environment that fosters the talents of our young people whilst expanding skills and confidence across a range of genres.

Rehearsing in our new state-of-the-art Performing Arts Centre, dancers train in several dance styles including jazz, hip-hop, lyrical, contemporary, classical ballet technique, and choreography. They will also explore different training approaches in the areas of anatomy and biomechanics of movement, stage production and injury prevention and rehabilitation.

Led by experienced and dedicated staff, the program is designed to challenge dancers through performances, annual showcases, and competitions. As students' progress, learn foundational skills related to theatre production such as sound editing, lighting design, marketing, and ticket sales.
